I would like to extend my sincerest thanks for my award of the Clint Foundation Scholarship for the second year in a row. Your generosity is appreciated more than you know.

This is my final year at Flagler College; though I do not graduate until December of 2004, I will not be attending classes at the institution as that final fall semester will be spent in a student teaching internship. If all goes well this semester, I will graduate cum laude with a grade point average of 3.5 with degrees in secondary education and English

I receive the Clint Foundation Scholarship because it is the main source of funding for the Resident Advisor program—which I have been a part of for two years. I became a Resident Advisor to gain leadership experience to supplement my pre-graduation classroom teaching experience. As a Resident Advisor, I am not only a disciplinarian—which I imagine I will do much of in my middle school and high school classrooms—but also I am a leader: I provide counsel and emotional guidance for my residents through their confusing beginning and challenging conclusion of their own college experience. I provide mentoring and tutoring not in the traditional academic setting, but in the real world.

I am thankful for the funding that the Clint Foundation Scholarship provides because the time that I would have spent in a minimum wage job to earn money for tuition can now focus on my residents—as individuals and as a community; I can concentrate on my purpose as a Resident Advisor rather than worrying about making ends meet in my own life. I hope that I will one day also be able to provide a student with the same opportunity to better their lives in order to give to others.
