I want to thank the Clint Foundation for its recent, generous gift to Tusculum College. The Clint Foundation has supported Tusculum for many years, and we value the continued interest in the College.

I am pleased to report that we have met the Clint challenge of \$30,000. Combined with the gift from the Foundation, \$35,000 in annual work-study scholarships was available this year. In addition, \$5,000 of the Foundation's gift was applied to the Clint Foundation Endowed Work-Study Scholarship Fund. 
The 2003-2004 academic year has been one of milestones and celebrations. In October, a ground-breaking was held for the library renovation and expansion project. Also during the fall, Tusculum dedicated the Niswonger Sports Complex, a state-of-the-art athletic facility, named for Scott M. Niswonger, class of 1987, Tusculum's largest benefactor; and Mastrapasqua Hall, one of the College's four new apartment-style residence halls, named for the Mastrapasqua family, who generously support the College. Work is also progressing on our new baseball stadium, which will serve as home site for the Greeneville Astros, the new Appalachian League affiliate of the Houston Astros, in addition to the Tusculum team.

In an effort to uphold and put into practice the Civic Arts, nearly 900 students, faculty, and staff provided more than 4,250 cumulative hours in service in Greene, Sullivan, and Washington counties in East Tennessee. Projects ranged from physical labor, such as restoring forest hiking trails or installing a fence row at a youth agency's equestrian center, to more cerebral projects like working with an adult literacy class or partnering with an elementary school to collect oral histories.

In January, we began celebrating the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the College's Graduate and Professional Studies program, which provides higher education opportunities for working adults. The program was honored with a House Joint Resolution during the March 25 Tennessee House of Representatives meeting in Nashville. In addition, a new Master of Arts in Education degree with a concentration in Human Resources was recently established.

We hope you are as excited as we are about the changes and growth of the College. The Clint Foundation has played an integral part in that growth, and we are grateful. I look forward to a continued partnership with the Foundation.
