WELCOME PIEDMONT VIRGINIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Piedmont Virginia Community College (PVCC) has joined the Clint Foundation schools who are working with us to aid deserving students who are working to support their goal of obtaining their education. We requested information from PVCC about their program and Mary Jane King, Director of Institutional Advancement, has submitted the following:

Piedmont Virginia Community College is a comprehensive, public, associate degree-granting institution. As part of the Virginia Community College System, Piedmont Virginia Community College serves the City of Charlottesville and six counties in Central Virginia.

College transfer and workforce development are the core of the college's mission. The first two years of baccalaureate study prepare students for success at four-year colleges and universities. Workforce development programs prepare students for successful careers and promote a skilled regional workforce by meeting the training and educational needs of employers.

PVCC is located at 501 College Drive in Charlottesville, Virginia. The 114-acre campus includes a main administration and academic building and the V. Earl Dickinson Building for Humanities and Social Sciences that opened in the fall of 1998. A new science building is expected to open in 2008.

PVCC served 6,502 individual students in credit classes during 2004-2005. In addition, 2,127 students enrolled in noncredit classes. More than 100,000 people have taken classes at PVCC since the college opened in 1972. In the region, more than 40 percent of all residents who attend Virginia colleges and universities are enrolled at PVCC and one in five high school graduates begins his/her higher education at PVCC.

Ms. King also reported that four students have been awarded scholarships funded by the Clint Foundation. All of the students are at least 25 years of age and three out of the four are returning to PVCC. "In all cases, these scholarships provided the access these adults needed to begin or renew their higher education experience."

CLINT RECIPIENT "GIVES BACK"

Beth Cartlidge, a Clint recipient from Jacksonville, Florida, is a prime example of the Clint Foundation's requirement to "give back".

Beth became an active volunteer at Alimacani Elementary School where her children, Ashley and Jack, attended. She became an advocate for all of the children and, when the school district began to cut programs, she used her position as editor of the newsletter to rally support that reached the district administration as well as the state legislature. This was so successful that not only were the programs restored, in some cases they were increased. For all her efforts, Beth was awarded the Duval County (Jacksonville) Volunteer of the Year for 2004-2005. Ashley is now in middle school and Beth is now volunteering at Fletcher Middle School as well as at Alimacani Elementary.

Realizing that she would need to re-enter the workforce in the near future, Beth has taken advantage of the opportunity that the Clint Foundation has offered her to return to school to obtain certification as a Reading Specialist as well as a Media Specialist (librarian). She hopes to use this joint certification to offer programs that will enhance the students' reading skills with the other educational disciplines.
