From the Board of Trustees:

Through the cooperation and support of all the parties involved, the Clint Foundation has been able to provide a significant contribution to education. For each dollar contributed, the Foundation receives up to three dollars from the participating colleges. This four dollars is then matched by four dollars from the students receiving the grant. This provides eight dollars for the education of working students.

If you consider the tax benefits for the contribution, the fact that all administrative expenses are contributed by the colleges and the Foundation, and the fact that each recipient has made a moral commitment to help someone else in the future, this initial contribution may increase ten to twenty times or more over the long term.

A better-educated people will provide solutions to the problems of the future. They will develop better methods to help feed the poor, cure the sick, provide new designs for buildings to resist earthquakes, and develop new methods to give advance

warnings for coming storms. All of these solutions will mitigate the disasters that we have faced in our lives.

What better way is there for us to insure a brighter future for those who follow?

News from the Colleges and Universities . . .

Flagler College in St. Augustine FL, lead by President Dr. William Proctor, was the first school to participate in the matching program with The Clint Foundation. Comments from the students in the Flagler program include: "I feel you are a part of my success", "I hope to give a scholarship to a student in the future", "Your help allowed me to continue to participate in extracurricular activities", "I was able to attend the summer session and graduate early", "Without your help I would not have received the same caliber of education", "It was a great relief to me and my parents to know here would be some extra help".

Hillsdale College in Hillsdale MI reports their SOAR (Service Opportunities and Rewards) program allows students to work for community service agencies at the college's expense. The typical student works eight hours per week and can earn up to \$1000 per academic year toward their educational expenses. Hillsdale is using The Clint Foundation grant and their matching 3 to 1 funds to support up to eight students in this program.

The Clint Foundation has joined with General Electric Capital and the I Have a Dream Foundation to assist deserving students from the KT Murphy Elementary School in Stamford CT. Clint has received matching grants from the **University of Connecticut and Norwalk Community Technical College** to help these students with their college requirements. Six students participated in this program in 1999. In the future grants will be available to the KT Murphy alumni to attend the other ten schools participating in The Clint Foundation program.

The Clint Foundation will contribute to Leadership Rice, a **Rice University** program to develop the leadership capacities of undergraduates from all disciplines. The Clint Foundation and Leadership Rice share common goals of assisting students who are willing to work full time in summer mentorships. The Foundation is committed to supporting Leadership Rice with funds that will be matched two to one by other contributions to the program. These funds will allow carefully selected students to work in challenging programs that contribute to the community need but cannot afford the help of talented interns. These students and, in fact, all Leadership Rice students, will accept a moral commitment to provide similar service to others after graduation.

The Clint Foundation was surprised and delighted when **Tusculum College** in Greeneville TN offered to match our contributions three to one. John Mays was most enthusiastic about the work ethic and moral obligation to help others that are basic to our program. The college used The Clint Foundation as a broad-based appeal to alumni and friends of the college who responded with matching amounts totaling \$10,500!

To quote a recipient of a grant at **Wesleyan College**, "When the financial aid office informed me of the award available for students willing to pay for their college education, I was very impressed by the generosity of the award. So often students like myself, who are not eligible for federal and state financial aid, find it very difficult to finance a college education."

Graham and Cottrill, P. A. will contribute to The Clint Foundation to start the program at **Rollins College**. Rollins has just been added to the list of participating schools.

Vista Hills Coffee a Contributor

Vista Hills Coffee, a pure Kona coffee, grown 1000 feet above the Pacific Ocean on the Big Island of Hawaii, is contributing 10% of all profits to The Clint Foundation.

This coffee is grown on the side of the volcano Hualalai directly upslope from Keauhou Bay in the center of the world famous coffee region of Hawaii. The gentle slopes and porous rocks of



Kona provide good drainage for optimum health of the plants. The coffee grows in the gentle morning sun and sweet afternoon showers common to this elevation. Pesticides are not sprayed on the plants. When ripe, the coffee is hand-picked. It is sun dried and then roasted.
