NEWS FROM GEORGE FOX UNIVERSITY

Meet Mandi Zollman

Mandi is one of the 2002-2003 Clint Foundation Scholarship Recipients at George Fox University. Mandi grew up in a small Eastern Oregon town named Joseph. Her family has gone through many changes including two divorces. Through the family transitions, in order to meet her college dreams and costs, Mandi has spent summers working up to three jobs including insurance office assistant, mowing lawns, foundry tour guide, title company assistant researcher, housekeeper and waitress. A college junior, Mandi is majoring in Psychology and minoring in Christian Ministries. She currently is serving as a dormitory resident assistant and is a ministry intern at Dayton Christian Church, working with the children's program. During her senior year, she will be an assistant area coordinator of two residence halls. Upon graduation, Mandi would like to go to graduate school and become a licensed professional counselor.

University Receives Gift of Land

George Fox University intends to build new athletic fields on 23.8 acres of property generously donated to the school by local residents and business owners, Ken and Joan Austin. The site, one-half mile north of the campus, will include a new track, soccer fields, baseball and softball fields. The athletic fields will significantly improve the quality of the fields to accommodate high volume use and meet NCAA Division III standards for post season play. This will also provide potential revenue from hosting events and competitions and free us much needed space contiguous to campus.

The estimated cost of the project, excluding the value of the land which is estimated at \$2.6 million, is \$7.5 million. Project costs include site preparation, natural turf soccer fields, synthetic turf surfaces for the track and field infield/soccer practice field and baseball and soccer fields. Timing of the site preparation and field construction will be contingent on securing gifts and pledges. The development staff and volunteer fund raising committee will explore all potential funding sources interested in athletics. The University does not have a long history of athletic fund raising. The last major fund raising effort was the Wheeler Sports Center which opened in 1977.
